Mariners are hereby advised that with effect from 00:00 hours [UT] on Tuesday 1st of March 2011 the Local Port Service [LPS] will no longer request a VHF call from Vessels arriving from the west and destined for the commercial ports of Cardiff, Barry, Newport and the independent berths on the River Usk when crossing the line joining Nash Point (51°24 '.10N 3°33 '.55W) and Hurlstone Point (51°13 '.93N 3°34 '.53W) South Wales Radio will no longer keep a listening watch on VHF channel 69

Both piloted and non pilot vessels will still be required to report in to their SE Wales destination port on the designated VHF Channel.

The LPS will provide a 24 hour point of contact and coordination service by Email, Fax, telephone and Via Agents for vessels destined for or within ABP's commercial ports of Cardiff, Barry, Newport and the independent berths on the River Usk and will supply, on request, general port specific information such as dock, lock and pilot cutter operational times; berth availability; pilot boarding times; planned shipping movements and meteorological and hydrological data.

During Tidal working times of 4 ½ hrs before HW Barry to 3 ½ hrs after HW Barry, Newport Barry and Cardiff Pilots will be contactable directly on VHF channel 06 and can give information regarding boarding times and positions.
